# **CONCEPT NOTE**

With the implementation of China's Belt and Road Initiative, more and more Chinese universities are bringing teaching resources abroad in response to this policy. At the same time, SEAMEO TED's leadership in technical curriculum development aligns with the needs of schools across Southeast Asia and is eager to implement internationally benchmarked courses. SEAMEO TED has also been actively promoting the internationalization of vocational courses and cooperating with many excellent Chinese universities.

In order to honor this precious cooperation and reward partners who have contributed, SEAMEO TED, together with its Chinese partner, Go Study Global Education, wants to initiate the China-SEA Partnership Workshop in Phnom Penh between January 15 and 16, 2024. Partner institutions from China and SEA countries will be invited to join and communicate with each other, sparkling new ideas and potentials for future collaboration.

As a result, it has driven and enriched the vocational education landscape in Southeast Asia, reflecting the collaborative spirit of our partnership and establishing a strong foundation for future institutional-level cooperation.

Hence, the co-organization of the China-SEA Partnership Workshop by SEAMEO TED and GS in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, holds significant importance. This workshop will promote educational cooperation between China and Southeast Asian countries, allowing Chinese institutions to showcase their expertise in vocational education and facilitate knowledge exchange with educational partners in Southeast Asia. Notably, Cambodia, as the host country, stands to benefit by establishing connections with educational institutions in both China and Southeast Asia.countries, fostering mutually beneficial collaboration, and further advancing internationalization efforts in its higher education sector.

The success of this workshop will not only drive vocational education development but also strengthen educational cooperation between China and Southeast Asian nations, making a positive contribution to broader educational objectives.

#### **PURPOSES OF THE WORKSHOP**

The workshop serves three purposes as follows:

Enhancing partnership between Chinese institutions and SEA institutions in terms of technical and vocational education and training (TVET);

Sharing best practices among Chinese and SEA participants on their achievements; and

Identifying alternative solutions to the challenges of TVET in the region by raising recommendations for consideration and decision. It will be tentatively attended by policymakers, curriculum developers, school management, the private sector, and teachers.

Through his curiosity and considerable efforts, he passed his competition to obtain a master's study scholarship in Canada. After two years of study, he completed his studies in educational sciences at the University of Sherbrooke, Canada.

He decided to come back to Cambodia and serve his country until now. He works hard to create new cooperation for the development of the institution

# TOPIC: INTERNATIONALIZATION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY OF CAMBODIA (ITC)

#### **BRIEFING:**

Internationalization is one of the important levers to support the sustainable development of an institution like ITC. You know, ITC has gone through several tough times. All infrastructure and human resources have been destroyed. We reopened this institute with 0 PhD lecturer. And now, thanks to our regional and international partners, we have around 100 PhD lecturers and researchers.

We sent our best students to different countries for master's, PhD and post-doc training and most of them came back and became ITC lecturers and researchers. With this well-qualified human capital, we can not only ensure quality training but also we have joint research with different partners such as AUF, AUN/SEED-Net, JICA (Japan), AFD (France), KOICA (Korea), IRD, CIRAD, universities from France, Belgium, Japan and Thailand.

Currently, we have about 7000 students, 342 faculty members, 109 researchers and 101 projects. The level of training goes up to doctorate.

Another very important point for ITC in terms of internationalization is that we have an INTERNATIONAL CONSORTIUM made up of around forty (40) biggest universities from around the world. Most of them are from France. Every year, in March, we meet to talk about the activities carried out in the past year and new perspectives for the new academic year.

Notably, he has successfully led multiple projects funded by national and regional foundations, contributed to key national scientific and technological projects as one of the core members, and completed over 50 engineering projects in urban transportation.

Professor LI has obtained 25 patents, developed transportation management systems widely used in Guangxi, and received Guangxi Provincial Technology Progress Award and Guangxi Technological Invention Award for three times for his contributions.

His research, comprising over 50 papers, is indexed in SCI and EI databases.

It takes one and half hour drive from Jakarta, the Capital City of Indonesia, to Bekasi Municipality. Bekasi is also surrounded by large industrial areas. It has become his challenge to manage the campus link and match it with industrial needs and innovation has become a powerful tool to deal with job-education mismatches.

He holds a Doctoral degree in Marketing Management from Pasundan University. It is a private university located in Bandung, West Java Province Indonesia. For him, studying marketing is an important thing to do. It is because marketing principles can be applied in most job positions and career paths.

His areas of interest include Strategic Management, Strategic Marketing and Entrepreneurship. To achieve this, we actively leverage on industry and international partnerships for learning of best practices and technology transfer; industry and overseas immersion to equip students with critical soft skills and real work experience; and creation of progression pathway for students to further deepen their skills. Today, ITE enjoys a strong network of valued industry and international partners. The presentation will broadly cover ITE's international partnership and engagement approach, some examples of best practices with partner institutions, as well as key outcomes and lessons.

TOPIC: INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION IN TVET NEW TEACHING AND LEARNING MODEL: THE APPLICATION OF DIGITAL MIND MAPPING IN ENHANCING VOCATIONAL LEARNING AMONG TVET STUDENTS

#### **ABSTRACT:**

IR 4.0 and digital revolution bring global challenges in TVET teaching and learning. Hence, sharing of effective practices especially in TVET new pedagogies are critical to buttress international educational partnership between ASEAN countries and China. Digital intelligence and tools can be used to enhance TVET learning. Visual aids have been transformed from traditional usage to digital applications. Besides being manually competent, majority of TVET (Technical and Vocational Education and Training) students are visual learners.

Digital mind map is digital visual aid that is becoming increasingly popular tool in teaching and learning. In digital era, professionals and students are using digital mind map to create outline, improve understanding, take notes during meetings and plan projects. Today, in teaching and learning, digital tools are preferable by teachers and students rather than the traditional tools. Based on the mind mapping theory, the main variables in this study included (a) speed and efficiency, (b) appearance and mechanics, (c) ontology and concept mapping, and (d) creativity.

Hence, this research aims to investigate the practice of digital mind map among vocational students in Malaysia. The empirical results showed that the TVET students have applied digital mind map to stimulate practical learning of technical subjects among vocational students in Malaysia. As a result, the CIC International Center was established with the goal of acting as the center for developing many organizations in Thailand's eastern region to the international level by organizing language assessments such as TOEIC, HSK, and English Score by the British Council.

#### TOPIC: TRANSFORM THE TRADITIONAL VOCATIONAL COLLEGE TO THE GLOBAL VOCATIONAL

#### **BRIEFING:**

10 years ago, vocational education produced graduates into the labor market that drives the economy both in Thailand and around the world. However, vocational education is not in Thailand. Moreover, English is our weakness. Although vocational students have professional skills that are accepted in the labor market, they still unable to step into the international market because of the lack of language skill.

In 2014, we started the international vocational education curriculum that can produce graduates from both industrial engineering and business administration fields with the ability to speak foreign languages Therefore, many projects, are being encouraged, such as the One on One IPad project, providing teaching and learning equipment to change the format of full creative teaching for Dual Degree which connects vocational education in Thailand to other countries around the world. We also use international standard tests to guarantee student quality before graduation.
