INTRODUCTION

Education has a central role to play in preparing learners for this fast and dramatically changing world and enabling them to navigate, and thrive in it. Through education, learners must be able to develop the right knowledge, skills and values for the 21st century. The so-called 21st century skills include critical thinking and problem-solving, creativity and innovation, communication and collaboration, initiative, responsibility and self-regulation, social and cross-cultural skills, and information and communication technology skills.



SEAMEO Regional Center for Technical Education (SEAMEO TED) has a mandate in conducting research, capacity building and advocacy partnership in the field of vocational and technical skills at secondary level in Southeast Asia. Cooperation and networking can be a key forerunner for problem identification and learning opportunities. However, lack of networking affects work effectiveness and quality. For example, the price of communication and transports across the geographical areas are obstacles for international cooperation and activity implementation. If there is no international and regional cooperation, new initiatives and innovation will not be achieved. The Southeast Asian region has considered Technical and vocational education and training networking as an important issue and the process of cooperation among the vocational and technical institutions in the region moves slowly and faces difficulty. Promoting a good collaboration among institutions and industries in technical-vocational education sector in the region is needed to strengthen the competence and to expand connectivity among vocational teachers and learners. Finally, advancing regional collaboration address skill mismatches, and enhance learning opportunities, best practice exchanges, and resource mobility. In order to ensure that SEAMEO TED delivers appropriate programmes and activities we need a lot of inputs from vocational-technical stakeholders in the region.









To support the regional programs, SEAMEO TED has established a SEA Vocational-Technical High School/College Network that serves as a forum for school leaders, researchers and teachers in secondary education level from the region. Through the network, the members can share and learn from each other the challenges and issues of technical education.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the network are as follows:

- 1 To share information, knowledge and experience on technical education among the participating members
- (2) To learn best practices of technical education among the members
- To promote capacity-building programs for teachers, school management and supporting administrators
- **4** To strengthen cooperation for mutual benefits among the members
- (5) To facilitate and implement the project/activity for regional prosperity

MEMBERS

Currently, the network consists of 81 vocational-technical high schools/colleges which offer upper secondary education program with 7,076 technical teachers and 121,720 students from the 11 SEAMEO member countries including Brunei Darussalam (2 schools), Cambodia (16 schools), Indonesia (19 schools), Laos PDR (2 schools), Malaysia (10 schools), Myanmar (5 schools), Philippines (17 schools), Singapore (1 school), Thailand (5 school), Timor-Leste (1 school), and Vietnam (3 schools).
